Notes of the Public Meeting
4th September 2019

16 residents present, including children.

Sue Lilly (Clerk) took those present through the most recent RoSPA report.

Kay Coldrick (Council Chairman) then opened to the floor for suggestion and comments.

- Do we need a playground at all? Who wants it?
- Why not take everything away?
- A roundabout would be great
- Is it worth keeping the slide?
- **Why not dig out the bank, reinforce it, renew the surface, that will give a bigger area*.**
- A climbing frame would be good
- A climbing wall would be good
- A fence is needed for ball games
- What about a shelter?
- What about a bench? (this might be possible as a Cuthbertson Memorial bench)
- We can paint the surface for hopscotch etc

Kay then summarised what must be done.....

- We must take the whirly and two springers away
- We must make-good the safety surface after the items have been removed
- We must repair the steps
- We should put up a fence, certainly fairly soon before West End goes on the market, so that the proximity of the playground does not deter buyers
- When the fence goes up, we can install a basketball/netball ring at the same time.

This is the minimum. This will be within budget, but needs to go to the full council for approval.

We can then apply for grants to provide a spinner/roundabout.
